Preparation of an original description and diagnosis of the subject of the study as a basis for the realisation of the aim of the thesis. 5. Development of a concept for a detailed analysis of all research aspects. 6. Preparation of development scenarios, forecasts or strategies concerning the researched problem. 7. Correct editing of the thesis text (communicativeness, scientific language of the study, bibliographic description, error control). 8. Preparation of bibliography, list of tables and figures according to the departmental template and instructions. 9. Preparation of a summary of the thesis in Polish and English.
