Subject objectives	The aim of the course is to acquire knowledge about the emergence and prevalence of risk factors for social exclusion. Students will become familiar with the specifics of working with clients who are beneficiaries of municipal social welfare centers (MOPR) or referred to support institutions by probation officers. The course will present the specifics of therapeutic work provided through support institutions such as courts, probation officers, family assistants, MOPR, etc. It will cover the characteristics of therapeutic work with individuals at risk of social exclusion due to factors such as extreme poverty, unemployment, addictions, and violence, as well as therapeutic work with entire families from the underclass group.
