Factors (social, political, economic and legal) affecting the development of penal law and procedure in the 18th and 19th centuries.</li> <li>3. Changes in penal law in the 18th and 19th centuries.</li> <li>4. Changes in penal procedure in the 18th and 19th centuries.</li> <li>5. Penal law and procedure in totalitarian states.</li> <li>6. Modern development of penal law and procedure (after 1945).</li> </ol>
