Principles and functions of criminal law. Issues of criminalisation. Sources of criminal law. Criminal law and its application. General notion of crime and offence. Structure of a criminal offence. Criminal liability and its prerequisites. The act and causation. Objective imputation. Stages and phenomenal forms of committing a criminal act. Exclusion of criminal liability. Counter-acts. Guilt and the exclusion of guilt. Social harm and its grading. Conflict of offences and provisions of the act. Demonstration of the problematic application of the principles of criminal responsibility by means of examples of selected types of crimes and offences.
