Subject contents	Grammar issues: alphabet, spelling, rules of pronunciation; conjugation of the auxiliary verbs "avere" and "essere" in the present tense, affirmative, negative, interrogative forms; definite and indefinite articles; nouns - genders, forming plurals, adjectives - conjugation by gender and number, division of verbs into regular conjugations, conjugation patterns in the present tense, conjugation of irregular verbs, cardinal and ordinal numbers, modal verbs - conjugation in the present tense, possessive pronouns and adjectives, simple prepositions and contracted irregular verbs, past perfect tense "passato prossimo" of regular, irregular and reflexive verbs - forms and rules of use. Lexical issues: formulas of greetings and farewells, courtesy questions about one's well-being, various polite phrases, bar, cafe, restaurant, phraseology of the verb "andare", ways of spending free time; description of the house, apartment; Christmas; family; clock, description of the day; dates; hobby; professions, languages and culture.
