Approximate main trends and directions of the evolution of literary phenomena. Imaginary geography is outlined, shaped in the literary works of that period. Introduced the most important poets, poets, playwrights, and playwrights. Students are responsible for the actual course of the discussion, which is conducted on the basis of group work, based on case studies, including the analysis of selected poems and dramas.
