<b>Subject objectives</b>	<p>During the lecture and exercises, the student learns the practical meaning and dogmatic construction of the discussed institutions of Roman private law and basic knowledge about their influence on the development of private law in modern times. He acquires basic information about the method of developing law in ancient Rome and the influence of Roman texts on the construction of legal science in medieval and modern Europe. The indicated scope of knowledge about Roman law should facilitate the student's understanding of the nature of concepts and institutions of modern private law, arising from the tradition of Roman law. The student also acquires the ability to use this legal tradition as a criterion for comparing different systems of private law and to independently assess the evolution and development of modern private law.</p>
