Collaborating with the internship supervisor in planning and conducting lessons, preparing teaching aids, organizing students' work, and assessing and evaluating students. Cooperating with other teachers, the class tutor, and specialists. Independently taking on the role of a teacher. Carefully and diligently planning and preparing lessons, including setting objectives, selecting methods and forms of work, and choosing teaching aids in a thoughtful manner adapted to the content being covered, the educational stage, and the group dynamics.
