Religious and secular theater in the Middle Ages: forms of medieval drama (liturgical dramatization, liturgical drama, mystery play, morality play, miracles); ways of staging medieval works. Humanistic theater: humanistic tragedy and comedy, pastoral drama; Terentius and perspective stage. The element of laughter in folk theater (parody sacra, meat-and-potatoes comedy, ribald comedy). Elizabethan theater: theater architecture, drama and authors; works of Christopher Marlowe and William Shakespeare.</p>
