<b>Subject objectives</b>	The aim of the seminar is to deepen students knowledge of constitutional law and to develop their skills in analyzing, interpreting, and applying the provisions of the Constitution of the Republic of Poland in administrative practice. Participants will learn about the significance of the fundamental principles of the state system, the relationships between public authorities, and the constitutional guarantees of individual rights and freedoms. The seminar also aims to prepare students to formulate research problems and to develop their bachelors theses based on legal sources, the case law of the Constitutional Tribunal, and relevant academic literature.
