Lack of a positive average in one of these parts results in the inability to take the PNJFR exam. The exam covers material from PNJFR I, PNJFR II, PNJFR III, PNJFR IV, PNJFR V and PNJFR VI. The exam consists of various parts that test the student's level of language competence. The student should receive at least a passing grade from each of these parts. The final grade of the exam is the average of the grades received from all parts. Receiving a failing grade from one part is tantamount to a failing grade for the entire exam, and this regardless of the grades received from the other parts.

Subject contents	The program and method of teaching are the same as in PNJFR V. Only the topics of documents (recordings, articles, excerpts from literary works) on which students will work differ. Listening comprehension and conversation: understanding longer speeches and lectures keeping up with even complex arguments, formulating extended statements on various topics, giving arguments for and against, actively participating in discussions on known topics, presenting their opinions and defending their views. Topics : e.g. art (painting, photography, sculpture, cinema), eating habits and gastronomy, progress and robotics. Writing and reading comprehension: understanding articles and papers related to contemporary issues in which the authors take certain positions and express certain views, understanding specialized articles in preparation for editing an undergraduate thesis, writing dissertations or papers, using systematically developed argumentation, emphasizing important issues and giving relevant examples. Competencies related to writing and reading comprehension are developed in parallel. Students read and analyze newspaper, specialized and/or literary articles in class and/or at home. Grouped into thematic blocks, the texts are suggested by the students themselves and the instructor. Work on the texts includes vocabulary, formal analysis, discussion, etc. Students write dissertation and thesis plans in class and/or at home. Students practice the use of "connecteurs logiques" etc.
