Subject contents	The lectures will explain terms such as folklore, folklorism, folkloristics. Features and functions of folklore and its taxonomy will be discussed. The following issues related to traditional folklore will be presented in greater detail: folk fairy tales and attempts to systematize them; the role of demonic beings in the life of Polish villages; the devil in folk culture; folk meteorology; rituals and traditions of the Polish countryside, with particular emphasis on the Christmas time. Some types of contemporary folklore will also be discussed in detail: urban legends, jokes, superstitions, political and strike folklore.
