Analysis of discourses on childhood and social ideologies of education contained in picturebooks for children (professional and non-professional significant adults intermediary between the book and the child). 2. An outline of the history of the art form (analysis of childhood and discourses) and an introduction to the theory of the picture book (the relationship between image and text and possible relationships between them; the educational potential of a picture book understood as a contemporary cultural medium; visual literacy and picture reading as a picture book task. 3. Content analysis of picture books: the importance of the so-called 'difficult topics', social taboos and stereotypes, and gender representations - their exemplifications in picturebooks and searching for their educational potential for practical use in working with children. 4. Analysis of the visual and linguistic aspects of picture books: illustrations in children's books as imaginative patterns about the world and introduction to the world of art (including contemporary art); aesthetics - art and kitsch in illustrations; psychological and aesthetic tasks of contemporary childrens illustration</p>
