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Subject contents	<p>The aim of the course is to introduce the student to the issues of state, law and politics. They will be presented during the lecture fundamental concepts of political science and jurisprudence. The concept of politics will be defined in various ways - its etymology, meanings and controversy regarding the interpretation of the term itself. Rational thinking about politics will be confronted with mythical thinking. The concepts of sacred and profane will be introduced, which are the key to understanding the earliest political communities. It will be defined the concept of political power and various forms of its legitimization - legal, traditional, charismatic. Various dimensions and aspects will be described political - purpose and teleology, hierarchy and structure of political society, four dimensions of social stratification (power, wealth, prestige, education), political system and legal system and their mutual relations, dimensions of political identity, coercion and violence in politics, relationships axiology and politics. Various historical forms of autocratic and democratic states will be discussed and mutually confronted. Separate lectures will be devoted to selected political ideologies - conservatism, liberalism, socialism, nationalism. At lectures issues related to the science of war and peace will be discussed. The last block of classes will be devoted to the basics of jurisprudence - the concept legal norms in various approaches, as well as distinguishing branches of civil, criminal and administrative law. Various systems will be discussed legal in a comparative perspective. The student will be introduced to the issues of constitutional law. The Constitution of the Republic of Poland will be shown against the background of the constitutions of other countries. The student will learn the systematization and hierarchy of sources of law.</p>
