During the seminar, the student acquires and develops skills appropriate to his or her research interests. The seminar leads to the writing of a master's thesis on a topic chosen by the student and its defense, corresponding to the problems of the specialty he or she has studied so far as a leading one. The approaches used to write the thesis are formulated and agreed upon with the thesis supervisor.
