Semester 2: Economy and economics (current economic situation of the country, Europe, the world, globalisation, etc.). Third world countries (charity, social organisations etc.). Human rights. Economy and economics: interdependence between the state and the economy, working in a company: drafting press releases, writing reports, conducting business correspondence: e.g. establishing and maintaining customer relations, writing complaints, writing and cancelling orders, conducting negotiations - argumentation. Lying, limits of freedom, etc.). Sentence transformations (nominalisation, verbalisation). The subject leader selects the specific content in the subject area.
