Exchange rate risk and hedging instruments. Economic and financial structure of the European Union. The banking sector in the European Union, supervision of the banking sector - EBA. Monetary policy in the European Union. Conditions of adopting a common currency in the European Union. Analysis of the situation of Poland, zloty vs. euro. Financial institutions operating in the European Union and in Poland. Consumer protection on the financial services market. Public finances in the European Union. The general budget of the European Union: income and expenditure in the context of implemented policies. European Union cohesion policy. Types and principles of EU funds functioning. Settlement of transactions in international trade. Incoterms - principles of determining terms of supply and international trade rules. Payment systems in the EU. Derivatives in foreign settlements. EXERCISES: The main principles of the European Union. Consequences of the homogeneity of the internal market, analysis of advantages and weaknesses. The implementation of economic policy within the Economic and Monetary Union - tasks The monetary market in the European Union - tasks The capital market in the European Union - tasks Objectives and mechanisms for their implementation in the European Monetary Union. The European Union's budget revenue system. Budgetary expenditure. Economic convergence criteria. Case study - selected European Union countries. Trade rules in the European Union. Case study. Currency and financial crises in the world and their impact on European Union finances. Determinants of the absorption of EU funds. Determining costs for documentary credit, documentary collection and bank guarantees - tasks Analysis of delivery costs in foreign trade transactions on the example of specific commercial invoices SWIFT, TARGET2 - tasks Use of derivatives of the exchange market and over-the-counter market. LABORATORIES: Exchange rates and the foreign exchange market. The role of exchange rates versus major world currencies. Exchange rate policy. Analysis of the impact of the exchange rate on monetary policy. Corporate exchange rate forecasting and its role in business. Futures market instruments: forwards, futures and options. Open economy. Analysis of factors affecting the domestic market. Capital structure of a multinational company. Foreign currency debt financing. Foreign investments, their types and ways of attracting them. Risks of a company's foreign investment. The EU multiannual financial framework. Practical aspects of the NextGenerationEU instrument. Selection and analysis of international financial instruments in the activities of different economic agents. Practical aspects of the impact of globalisation on international trade. Consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic for markets in the European Union. The European Stability Mechanism - practical aspects of its activities. Analysis of tax systems in the EU. Tax havens.
