Basics of civil and commercial law (key concepts and issues introducing a given branch of law, including, among others, entrepreneur, enterprise, company, liability for obligations, civil law entities, special regulations concerning commercial law companies, conditions for the validity of legal acts (invalidity, ineffectiveness), sanctions for defective legal acts, form of legal acts, limitation of claims. 3. Principles of undertaking and conducting business activity: free, licensed and regulated activity. 4. Forms of conducting business activity. 5. Construction of a contract in business transactions - elements, parties, selected contractual clauses. 6. Appeal proceedings in civil cases. 7. Basics of family law. 8. Securities and enforcement in business transactions. 9. Industrial property law. 10. Intellectual property law, including the law of new technologies. 11. Competition law. 12. Legal aspects of e-marketing and advertising. The curriculum content of the subject includes the minimum curriculum requirements referred to in the Regulation of the Minister of Infrastructure and Development of June 12 2014 on the minimum program requirements for postgraduate studies in real estate valuation: • General part of civil law (8 hours), Selected issues in the field of family and inheritance law (4 hours). • Civil law entities • Specific regulations concerning commercial companies (personal and capital) • Prerequisites for the validity of legal acts • Sanctions for defective legal acts (invalidity, ineffectiveness) • Form of legal acts • Limitation of claims • Matrimonial property regimes • Management of the spouses' joint property • Management of the child's property by parents • Spouses' liability for debts • Prerequisites for inheritance of real estate
