Subject objectives	The aim of the course is to familiarize students with the legal foundations of liability for offences against public safety and their significance for the functioning of public administration. The lectures cover the provisions of petty offence law. Students gain knowledge about the structure of authorities responsible for preventing and prosecuting offences and their mutual relations. They also learn to analyse case studies of law violations, identify the elements of offences, and understand the principles of legal liability. Another objective of the course is to develop awareness of the importance of prevention and the role of public administration in maintaining public safety.

Subject contents	The course content includes an overview of the fundamental issues of petty offence law in the context of protecting public safety. The lectures analyse legal provisions regulating offences against the safety of persons and property, public order and peace, as well as safety and order in transportation. Particular emphasis is placed on identifying the elements of offences, the conditions of liability, and the sanctions provided for their commission. The lectures also present the competences of public administration bodies and law enforcement authorities in preventing offences, as well as their mutual institutional relations. Current practical problems arising from case law and legislative changes are discussed. An important part of the course is the analysis of examples of offences and their consequences for public safety, as well as discussions on preventive measures and possibilities for improving the effectiveness of administrative actions in this area.
