Can the following persons, while holding office or performing their duties, be members of management boards, supervisory boards or audit committees of municipal companies? • commune heads (mayors, city presidents), deputy commune heads (mayors, city presidents), members of county boards, members of provincial boards, • treasurers and secretaries of local government units at all levels, • managers of organisational units of municipalities, districts and provinces persons managing and members of management bodies of municipal, district and provincial legal entities, • persons issuing administrative decisions on behalf of the mayor (mayor, city president), district administrator and provincial marshal. Question 2 Does the prohibition on holding the position of a member of the supervisory board apply to commercial law companies of the State Treasury, state legal entities, companies in which the State Treasury holds more than 50% of the share capital or 50% of the number of shares, local government units, their associations or other legal entities of local government units? Question 3 Can a councillor sit on the supervisory board of a municipal company? Question 4 What qualifications should a candidate for membership of the supervisory board of a municipal company have?
