Subject contents	The course program assumes presenting issues in the field of general administrative proceedings, including: - introductory issues (including the concept, structure and functions of administrative proceedings, the subject of administrative proceedings, general and specific types of administrative proceedings, modes of administrative proceedings, instances of administrative proceedings, stages of administrative proceedings); - entities conducting administrative proceedings; - party and participants in administrative proceedings; - initiation of administrative proceedings; - course of administrative proceedings and individual institutions during administrative proceedings; - discontinuation of administrative proceedings; - decisions and rulings of the authority in administrative proceedings; - silent settlement of the matter; - amicable settlement of matters; - issues of verification of administrative decisions and rulings; - ordinary means of appealing against the decision of the first instance body (appeal and request for reconsideration of the case), appeal proceedings and decisions of the second instance body; - means of appealing against rulings, complaint proceedings; - extraordinary administrative proceedings; - types of proceedings regulated in the Code of Administrative Procedure other than general administrative proceedings. Additionally, the program content includes issues related to administrative court proceedings: - models of judicial control of public administration;- structure of administrative justice in Poland; - scope of jurisdiction of administrative courts; - structure of a complaint to the provincial administrative court; - general characteristics of the proceedings before the provincial administrative court and the judgments issued therein; - general description of the issue of appealability of judgments of provincial administrative courts to the Supreme Administrative Court.
