Students will become acquainted with the diversity of legal systems and legal families worldwide and will learn about fundamental principles of contract law, tort law, commercial law, public international law, and intellectual property law. The course aims to develop skills in analyzing and interpreting legal provisions and applying them practically in business activities.
