Subject objectives	The aim of the course is to broaden students' knowledge and skills in the field of heritage studies. The course consists of three blocks: heritage studies in design, artistic textiles, and furniture. The block of classes devoted to design aims to present the issues of modern design, which differs from traditional arts and crafts due to differences in production mechanisms and social functions, treated as one of the fields of art history. The aim of the block devoted to the history of artistic textiles is to familiarize students with the issues of artistic textile production in terms of fields and chronology, highlighting issues related to the history of art (collecting, exhibiting, and antiquing). Classes devoted to furniture familiarize students with the techniques and technology of furniture production, as well as the typology of these products. Subject contents	The program of the monument studies elective takes into account various areas of monument studies knowledge, above-standard or unusual program content that is not covered in other classes. In this way, students have the opportunity to familiarize themselves with issues that usually go beyond the scope of traditionally understood art history knowledge. The program content is based on the specialist knowledge and experience of the lecturer, often going beyond the issues available in the literature on the subject. The subject of design heritage studies, beyond a general chronological outline of the history of design (from the mid-18th century) , it addresses specific issues related to the design of objects for mass production and the history of the conceptualization and implementation of designs, as well as specific issues related to design heritage (collecting, exhibiting, and the antiques market). The study of artistic textiles includes an overview of weaving techniques, the production and function of textiles, and the stylistic and ornamental repertoire in the field of carpet weaving, the production of decorative silk fabrics, tapestries, and others. The study of furniture will cover the following topics: 1. Introduction (Egyptian, Greek, Etruscan, Roman furniture) 2. Furniture construction, carpentry techniques, and decorative motifs. 3. Romanesque and Gothic furniture. 4. Renaissance furniture. a) Italianism. b) Differentiation of furniture. 5.
