Introduction to thematic vocabulary, e.g. greeting, farewell, polite expressions, acknowledgments, apologies; making acquaintances; question marks, confirmations, consents, denials, refusals, expressions of satisfaction; making wishes and greetings; time, names of days of the week, month, season; weather and natural phenomena; address, place of residence.
