Subject contents	Basics of lexicography: types of dictionaries, structure of dictionary entries, qualifiers. Lexicology: word as a unit of the lexical system, meaning of a word, lexical collocations, polysemy; semantic relations in lexis hyponymy and hyperonymy, antonymy, synonymy, homonymy, paronymy; unmarked and marked vocabulary (chronologically, stylistically, emotionally-expressively); loanwords. Phraseology: characteristics of phraseological units; semantic relations in the phraseological subsystem. Word formation: structure of a word; types of morphemes; morphemic analysis of a word; units of the derivational system; derivational base and derivative types of affixes; morphological methods of word formation; derivational analysis of a word.
