Differences between the articulatory base of Spanish and Polish. - Phonetic and phonological description of the standard pronunciation variant of Spanish. - Co-existence of phonological systems: <i>estilo tenso</i> vs <i>estilo relajado</i>. - Vowel classification: vowels and consonants; voiced and voiceless sounds; oral and nasal sounds. - Classification of vowels. Pronunciation of vowels. Diphthongs. Triphthongs. Dissonance. - Consonant classification. Pronunciation of consonants. - Phenomena: <i>yeísmo</i>, <i>seseo</i>, <i>ceceo</i>, <i>aspiración de las consonantes</i>. - Similarity of sounds. - Vowel-to-vowel linking and consonant-to-consonant linking. <i>Sinalefa</i>. <i>Sinéresis</i>. - Phonetic varieties of Spanish: <i>variedades peninsulares</i>, <i>variedades hispanoamericanas</i>. - Syllable definition and syllabic division. - Types of accent; the distinctive function of accent. Word accent. Accent in a sentence. - Intonation. Functions of intonation. Breath groups. Tone unit. Cadence. Anticadence. Patterns of intonation. - Phonetic transcription.
