Subject contents	Threats to trees resulting from growing construction, transportation, and underground infrastructure needs in urban areas; the impact of urban conditions on the condition of trees; the impact of trees on environmental conditions in the city; nuisances resulting from the presence of street trees; achieving and maintaining a stable tree structure, pruning, irrigation and fertilization, removing hazards and preventing the development of diseases and pests; protection of trees against soil compaction, salinization, and pollution; agrotechnical and structural solutions; methods of protecting trees during construction works; problems of old tree stands and rules for introducing new plantings; selection of trees for tree stands; trees in the city as an element of infrastructure, tree stand plans.
