Subject contents	To test, consolidate and expand the skills and knowledge of the basic concepts of cultural sciences, especially regarding its symbolic and communicative sphere. To learn about its internal differentiation (taking into account the principle of distinguishing cultural domains), Recalling and consolidating the concept of sign and its typology, systematizing the basic concepts and functions of semiotics (message, text, text of culture) and other methodologies for studying cultural texts (including psychoanalysis, structuralism, poststructuralism, feminism, gender studies, postcolonial theories postcolonial). To learn methods of analyzing cultural texts (also in the context of analyzing a work of art); to become familiar with various ways of "reading cultural texts" in the context of applied methodologies, conducted research and methodology (including the objectives and conditions of such analysis). Arrangement of the principles of distinguishing aesthetically charged cultural texts, systematization of the types of aesthetic experience (including taking into account musical experience implying the semiotic character of music reception). Learning the principle of defining a work of art (W. Tatariewicz), recalling (introducing) the concept and function of a work of art, systematizing the basic principles of interpretation and evaluation of works of art. To discuss issues concerning the formal, semantic and psychological aspects of the analysis of a work of art and their practical application in the analysis of literary, plastic and film works (texts) (including the ability to verify and evaluate them). Familiarization with the topics, ideology and cultural-historical contexts necessary in the reception of selected cultural texts.
