We will not follow the history of the views of great philosophers. We will ask questions (e.g., what is tolerance? Why act honestly when dishonesty pays off? Do lawyers know anything about the law?) and look for answers to them, possibly referring to their works. The aim is also to show that philosophizing is the art of clearly and coherently justifying one's judgments. We will be guided by a concise and accurate definition of philosophy as reflection on thinking.
