Subject contents	The course involves practical training in reading medieval Latin and German manuscripts, taking into account the various types of script characteristic of that period. Students will learn about the development of script forms, as well as their regional and functional variations. During the course, examples of manuscripts are analysed, enabling students to develop their ability to recognise letters, abbreviations and other elements characteristic of medieval writing. Particular emphasis is placed on practical exercises in reading texts
