Statistical estimation; Sources of demographic statistics from the 16th to the early 19th century (state censuses, treasury sources, church censuses); Preferences in the choice of statistical methods. Development of statistical material; Measures of central tendency - classical and positional averages; Measures of dispersion and measures of asymmetry; Types of chronological series; Absolute and relative growth, indices of dynamics; Equation of chronological series, extraction of seasonal variations, extraction of trend; Analysis of interdependence of phenomena (structure index, intensity index); Methods of studying the state and natural movement of the population (population structure by sex, age and marital status, family reconstruction method); Population relations (population density, urbanisation process, natural population movement).
