Subject contents	1. Integrated Kashubian language course (30 h) - aimed at comprehensive development of receptive (listening and reading) and productive (speaking and writing) skills, including grammatical issues appropriate to the level and developing lexical resources. Thematic areas: Kashubian alphabet, introducing yourself, family, food, colors, telling time (seasons, months, days of the week), weather, parts of body, appearance, clothes, most important holidays (according to the calendar). 2. Writing (30 h): writing down statements (adjusted to level) by listening; working with the dictionary of Kashubian dialects by B. Sychta - rewriting folklore texts in accordance with modern spelling standards; familiarizing students with the structure of written texts (stories), practicing the ability to prepare short written forms (wishes, announcements). 3. Lexicon and conversations (30 h): enriching vocabulary (in the thematic areas presented in point 1) and using it during conversations; participation in talks moderated by the lecturer (adapted to the students' linguistic competence). 4. Field activities (30 h): learning about the region's resources, walking in Kashubian footsteps (e.g. Gdańsk, Oliwa, Gdynia, Wejherowo, Kartuzy, Kościerzyna), visits to the offices of external stakeholders, meetings with representatives of Kashubian culture, participation in Kashubian artistic events and cultural contact with the Kashubian language in practice. Due to its dependence on external factors, the program is adjusted on an ongoing basis in consultation with the students. Components 1 and 2 also include spelling issues: familiarizing students with the basic principles of Kashubian spelling. Components 1 and 3 also include phonetic issues: familiarizing students with the phonetics of the Kashubian language from a practical perspective, phonetic exercises (pronunciation of vowels and consonants in words and sentences). Components 1-3 also include grammatical issues: noun and adjective declination, verbal inflection.
