Subject contents	1. Integrated Kashubian language course (30 h) - aimed at comprehensive development of receptive (listening and reading) and productive (speaking and writing) skills, including grammatical issues appropriate to the level and developing lexical resources. Thematic areas: free time, entertainment, Kashubia, study and work, professions, everyday activities, personal characteristics, animals in the countryside and exotic animals, plants, exams, university, current events, journalism, some Kashubian holidays and traditions (extension). 2. Writing (30 h): writing down statements (adjusted to level) by listening; working with the dictionary of Kashubian dialects by B. Sychta - rewriting folklore texts in accordance with modern spelling standards; practicing the ability to prepare written forms (characteristics, report, review, landscape description, letters). 3. Lexicon and conversations (30 h): enriching vocabulary (in the thematic areas presented in point 1) and using it during conversations; participation in talks moderated by the lecturer (adapted to the students' linguistic competence). Components 1 and 2 also include spelling issues: familiarizing students with the advanced principles of Kashubian spelling. Components 1-3 also include grammatical issues: verb in the imperative and conditional forms, impersonal verb forms, past perfect tense, comparative and superlative (adjectives and adverbs).		
Prerequisites and co-requisites	Due to the need to properly implement the study plan and educational program, the student should first receive a pass in the subject: practical learning of the Kashubian language II. In special cases, the instructor may decide otherwise.
