	History and culture of seventeenth-century England (conflict between the Stuarts and Parliament; Civil War and the Commonwealth; the politics, culture and literature of the Restoration, Glorious Revolution; scientific revolution and its impact on the worldview, literature and culture; John Locke and his influence on Enlightenment culture).		
	Great Britain during the Enlightenment (party system and the development of Cabinet; the role of the press and the fight for freedom of speech; artistic and intellectual movements from Neoclassicism to Romanticism and their main representatives; intellectual and social developments leading to the rise of the novel; colonial expansion and the loss of American colonies; the beginnings of the Industrial Revolution; the French Revolution and its political and cultural impact in Britain).		
	Great Britain during the nineteenth century (the Industrial Revolution and the social and political changes caused by industrialisation and urbanization; the main representatives of culture and art of the Romantic and Victorian periods; the beginnings of popular culture; women's movement; the development of the British Empire).
