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Subject contents	The courses in the course Translation in Language Pair A-B I-III are not assigned to semesters. They fulfill the same learning outcomes, but in relation to three different subfields of translation. There are three courses in the study cycle from the following. Course 1: Simultaneous Interpreting 30h The aim of the course is for students to master the techniques of dealing with the challenges of simultaneous interpreting (whispered and booth interpreting), to learn the basic directions of Interpreting Studies, and to improve the broadly understood workshop of a conference interpreter also in terms beyond the technical aspects of the profession. Course 2: Localization Translation 30h. The aim of the course is for students to achieve translation competence in video game localization based on applied industry standards, game and text genres, stylistics appropriate for them, and creative and standard terminology. In addition to practical translation of authentic texts, the course also includes evaluation of translation quality in accordance with industry practice. Course 3: Marketing Translation 30h In this course, students will gain competence in translating marketing texts, including slogans, advertisements, product descriptions, company descriptions and consumer surveys with a special focus on creative style and specialized terminology. Course 4: Post-editing of machine translation 30h In this course, students develop practical skills in post-editing machine translation. Practical tasks are performed based on the output of various translation engines (DeepL, Google Translate, Microsoft Translator, e-translation), taking into account multiple levels of text organization (lexis, terminology and phraseology, syntax, punctuation) and the most common consequences of using MT. A particularly important issue analyzed in the course is the flow of information in the text (information flow) and the thematic and grammatical structure of individual utterances that determines such flow.
