Entry requirements The student has basic and structured knowledge of the seminar subject; knows the basics of research work developed during the first and second year of studies; has the ability to work independently; can work in a group. In the case of foreign students, it is necessary to know the Polish language well enough to understand the content presented during classes and actively participate in them. In special cases, the instructor may waive from the above requirements.
