Articulation (place and manner) of vowels. Monophthongs (long and short vowels and diphthongs - comparison with Polish, basic errors, reduction in unaccented syllables and in the rhyme []), explosive, slit consonants. Prosodic plane of German (intonation and accent). Word and sentence accent. Suprasegmental elements, pause.
