In each higher semester of study, listening texts and reading texts contain richer subject matter and a higher degree of differentiation of lexical-grammatical structures. Leading themes: Music (what is music, what do we listen to, making music, music as a profitable business); Literature (the place of literature in our lives, reception and interpretation of literary works, characters and personalities, book fairs); Colours (individual perception of colours, the effect of colours on well-being); Work (the importance of work, new concepts of the workplace, women in the sciences, unusual careers); Photography (history of photography, optics).
