Subject objectives	The aim of the course is to demonstrate the role of literature in introducing phenomena such as tolerance, respect for human rights, openness to differing worldviews, and the equal rights of men and women in access to the public sphere into the social and cultural discourse of Sweden. These issues are discussed using examples of the most significant works and authors in Swedish culture. The starting point is a reflection on the literariness of the discussed work.

Subject contents	The course covers trends in 20th and 21st-century Swedish literature. The thematic units correspond to course meetings. A detailed list of readings will be provided by the lecturer during the first class. Topics include: the proletarian and modernist movements in Swedish literature, works by P. Lagerkvist and other Nobel Prize laureates, prominent poets of the 20th and 21st centuries, Swedish troubadours and humorists, reportage literature, politically and socially engaged literature (including women's literature), and engaged poetry. The Christian trend in poetry and prose is also discussed in the context of secularization, contemporary drama and theater in Sweden, major trends in recent Swedish prose, and Swedish postmodernism in poetry and prose.
