Subject contents	Topics of the lecture in semester 2: Characteristics of Old Slavic writing: Serbian and Croatian monuments of the Old Slavonic editorial office. Serbian writing of the Cyrillic-Methodian era. Old Slavic literature in translation. Serbian literature of the oldest era - genre and stylistic characteristics. Serbian literature of the Nemanjić era. Literature of the post-Kosovo era: Kosovo literary mythology. Literature of medieval Bosnia. The era of Turkish occupation. The image of the nation and folk literature. Literature of the transitional period (the era of changes). Literature and religion: Serbian monastic literature; Croatian tradition antemurale christianitatis. Medieval Croatian literature (genre and stylistic characteristics). Croatian Glagoliticism. Development of religious drama. Croatian Latinists. Croatia between Latin culture and the Cyrillo-Methodean tradition.		
Prerequisites and co-requisites	Since the subject is a presentation of the history of Serbian and Croatian literature in a historical and cultural context, the student is required to complete the course Introduction to Literary Studies - 1st semester of the first year of studies in Slavic Studies.The condition for obtaining a pass allowing you to take the exam is passing the exercises (according to the instructor's requirements).
