Subject contents	The lecture topics will refer to the phenomenon of libertinism from the 16th to the beginning of the 19th century in a wide spectrum of contexts and based on European influences combined with Polish specificity. One of the topics will concern the semantic plane of the term libertinism in its linguistic and semantic dimension based on various dictionaries and encyclopaedias of the modern era. The subsequent lecture will address the intellectual discourse both philosophical and scientific related to the concept of nature, the universe, Epicureanism and the Democritan theory of atoms, views and positions towards the Christian paradigm. The final lecture will focus on moral and moral norms in the context of literary forms and cultural-social attitudes, representing a polemical stance up to and including negation towards recognised rules.
