Detailed analysis (structure, dynamics, barriers, cause-effect relationships, effects). 7. Creation of development scenarios, forecasts or strategies in relation to the issues studied. 8. Editing the text of the bachelor's thesis (scientific language of the study, bibliographic description, error control). 9. Preparation of tables and graphic illustrations. 10. Preparation of the bibliography of the work, list of tables, figures and charts in accordance with the faculty template and instructions. 11. Principles of writing the introduction and conclusion. 12. Preparation of a summary - summary of the bachelor's thesis in English. 13. Intellectual property protection and copyright.
