Syntax of contemporary Swedish language (sentence and its parts analysis, sentence analysis, structure of Swedish sentences in active and passive voice, structure of impersonal sentences, sentence pattern; deviations from the basic pattern, compound sentences, subordinate sentence pattern, types of subordinate sentences). Word formation in Swedish (derivational word formation: concept of affix, main derivational types in Swedish, functions of individual derivational affixes), compounds: forms of compounds and their types.
