Historical and cultural determinants of the formation of modern Pomeranian society; the most important events in the history of Pomerania and their impact on the culture and life of the inhabitants; the religious, linguistic, national structure of Pomerania until 1945. 2. Eastern Pomerania after World War II- displacement of German population, migration, territorial and ethnic origin of new residents of Pomerania; post-war nationality policy in Pomerania after 1945. 3. Ethnological research in Pomerania in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries- researchers, publications, achievements; precursors of ethnological research; German, Kashubian, Polish researchers of the language and Kashubian in the nineteenth century and early twentieth century; Pomerania in the research of Polish ethnologists in the interwar period; researchers and paradigms in ethnological research of Pomerania after 1945. 4-8. ethnographic regionalization of Pomerania "old lands": Kashubia with the Slowinski region, Bory Tucholskie, Kociewie, Powiśle - characteristics and transformations of regional cultures; continuation, reconstruction, inventing heritage. 9-10 Postmigration areas - "new lands" Człuchów land, Lębork land, Słupsk land; new society and its peculiarities; ethnographic characteristics; process of (re)construction of identity in postmigration areas. 11-12 National minorities in Pomerania past and present and their characteristics; Ukrainians, Belarusians, Russians, Lithuanians, Roma, Armenians; Jews in Pomerania - their history and culture. 13. Traditional culture as a "tourist product"-a chance for survival or a threat; institutionalized treatments around the traditional culture of Pomerania-entries on the list of intangible cultural heritage, reconstructions, inventing heritage. 14-15. Screening of films on Pomeranian themes.
