Subject contents	Introduction to the subject of Literary Studies as a philological discipline. What is literature? Determinants of the literariness of a text and the functions of literature. The development of AI and literature: potential and risks.Hermeneutics as a science of text comprehension. Text as an object of interpretation and over-interpretation. Elements of a literary text relevant to the process of analysis and interpretation of a literary work. Types and genres of literature. Elements of narratology: narrator, perspectives and narrative categories. Time and space in epic texts. Contexts of interpretation. Selected schools, concepts and methods of literary studies. Literary studies workshop: preparation of bibliography and footnotes.Terminology in Polish and German relating to text analysis and literary studies.
