Subject contents	The subject develops reflection on the object (literature) and the cognitive subject and his way (method) of reaching knowledge about a literary work (about the world and himself) in modern literary theory. The multiplicity of its connections (adoption of concepts and methods) with other scientific fields (linguistics, philosophy, history, psychology, sociology, rhetoric, translation theory), provides justification for presenting its interdisciplinary character, especially against the background of the main anti-positivist philosophical and methodological directions of the 20th century (psychoanalysis, structuralism, phenomenology, hermeneutics, deconstructivism, narratology, formalism, New Criticism, mythographic criticism/ archetypal analysis, interpretive theory, thematic criticism, psychoanalysis, sociology of literature, cultural materialism, new historicism, reception criticism/aesthetics of reception, feminist theory, poststructuralism, postcolonialism/orientalism, gender theory, queer theory, affect theory, camp, hermeneutics).
