Subject contents	The subject of the exercises will be considerations on basic concepts in the field of lexicology, lexicography and stylistics. The concept of a lexical unit and the relationship between a lexeme and a word will be explained. The following will be presented: basic sections of lexicology (etymology, semantics, phraseology), with attention to aspects of word meaning (associative, stylistic, structural meaning, etc.) and the concept of the semantic field and the relationships between its components (synonymy, antonymy, homonymy). In addition, selected issues from historical lexicology will be discussed (archaisms, neologisms, lexical borrowings, as well as the history of Polish lexicography, followed by the structure of the entry article, ways of defining a dictionary entry and the types of contemporary dictionaries. At the same time, the basic issues of practical stylistics will be explained.
