Emergence and fall of the Manchu empire - Dynasty Qing. Western influences in the 19th century - Opium Wars, Taiping and Boxer Rebellions. Republican Revolution, activities of President Sun Yat-sen - Republic of China. China at the crossroads, Japanese aggression and civil war - Nationalists and Communists.
