Subject contents	The curriculum content of the course <i>Professional Internship</i> in the field of Sinology includes: 1. identification of ones own academic interests and a summary of skills and competencies influencing the choice of the internships nature; 2. completion of the internship at a specified place and in a specific position; 3. familiarization with available internship opportunities and applying for them in appropriate institutions; 4. preparation of an internship plan (objectives, main tasks, and skills to be acquired) and its approval by the internship supervisor; 5. application of linguistic, cultural, and social knowledge, as well as practical language skills and social competencies, in performing tasks assigned by the host institution; 6. participation in discussions regarding gained experiences, skills, and competencies; 7. submission of complete documentation confirming the completion of the internship for course credit.
