Subject contents	Students learn about the issues and techniques of directing work on a film set and managing post-production processes. They learn (through case studies - discussing selected film excerpts and interviews with directors) what the work of a film director looks like at successive stages of filmmaking: selecting and interpreting a script, creatively supervising the filmmaking process, cooperating with various departments of the film crew (including actors, production, post-production, cinematography, editing).
